

## QUEENSLAND POLICE SERVICE DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION REVIEW

# How to take part

The Queensland Human Rights Commission (the Commission) is undertaking a review of diversity and inclusion in the Queensland Police Service.

The focus of our review is the recruitment and retention of women, First Nations, and culturally and linguistically diverse police.

## Why take part?

Having your voice heard, in a confidential setting, is an opportunity to shape the future of Queensland Police Service and to make a difference to the culture of the organisation.

A more diverse and inclusive QPS will benefit current and future officers by providing a more contemporary workforce, and improving policing outcomes by better reflecting the communities police serve.

## Who can take part?

All current, previous, or prospective police officers and police liaison officers are invited to participate in the Review. We want to hear from as many police and liaison officers as possible who are women, First Nations people, or from culturally diverse communities.

We are not collecting information from public service officers who work for the Queensland Police Service, members of the public, or victims/survivors of domestic and family violence who are not police members.

## How can I participate?

The consultation phase of the review closed on 1 May 2024. Participants engaged in the review in a range of ways, including:

- participating in a one-on-one confidential conversation
- filling in an online survey
- sharing their views and perspectives in writing.

We are conducting an online survey which is available to current QPS police and police liaison officers.

## Confidential conversations

The review has held one-on-one confidential conversations with current, previous, and prospective police officers and police liaison officers. Each confidential conversation was conducted by two Commission team members and participants were given options on how they would like the information to be captured.

## Register for a confidential conversation

Registrations for our one-on-one confidential conversations have now closed.

## Online survey

We have launched an online survey which is available to QPS members.

## Site visits

During the consultation phase of the review, members of our team visited stations in different regions of Queensland. We shared information about what we are doing, talked about why diversity matters, and heard from QPS members about their experiences and perspectives firsthand.

We have now visited over 21 QPS sites. Our site visits have included:

- Logan: 8 February 2024
- Gold Coast: 21 February 2024
- Central Region – Mackay and Rockhampton: 5-6 March 2024
- Southern and North Coast Region – Warwick, Dalby, Murgon and Tewantin: 11-14 March 2024
- Far North and Northern Region – Cairns, Mareeba, Townsville: 18-21 March 2024
